## VOCABULARY

**Directions:** Frontload (introduce and review) these vocabulary words with your students to facilitate their understanding of the topic and coinciding resources:

- 1. **Census** (n.) An official surveying or count of the population
- 2. **Demographic** (n.) Information about the characteristics (age, gender, income, etc.) of a particular group of people
- 3. **Election District** (n.) One of a fixed number of areas into which a state is divided, each district elects one member to the U.S. House of Representatives.
- 4. **Gerrymander** (v.) To change or manipulate the boundaries of a legislative district to favor one political party over others
- 5. **Redistrict** (v.) To divide into new districts, usually related to an election
