



EXTEND THE RESOURCES

Below is a list of ideas and ways you might use the resources provided on this Classroom Law Project resource page to extend learning and civic engagement for your students:

Start with Choice & Inquiry:

Each of the sections on this Current Event Resource Page connects to the 2021-2022 Supreme Court Term and its most recent docket of cases. There is a case or topic addressed by one of the cases that should reach any student's interest. Give students the opportunity to choose a case or topic centered within a case of interest and start with that.

Extensions:

- Choose an issue that will be adjudicated by the Supreme Court this term and have students engage students in a Socratic Seminar centered on the issue(s) at large.
- Use one or more of the cases that will be decided this term to create a Structured Academic Controversy with your students. In addition to using the primary issues of the cases, you or your students can extrapolate larger societal topics/impacts that may be ripe for discussion in a SAC format.
- For high school students, you can have them research the various steps involved with any individual Supreme Court case (e.g., the process, oral arguments, conferencing, opinion writing, etc.).  - This lesson can then be followed up with students either individually, in pairs or small groups researching cases decided either during this term or last term and reporting out their findings to their classmates.
