- 1. **Strike** (n.) A work stoppage, caused by the mass refusal of employees to work.
- 2. Labor (n.) Workers considered as a group.
- 3. **Union** (n.) an organized association of workers, often in a trade or profession, formed to protect and further their rights and interests.
- 4. **Collective Bargaining** (v.) Negotiation of wages and other conditions of employment by an organized body of employees.
- 5. **Wage** (n.) A regular payment, typically paid on a daily or weekly basis, made by an employer to an employee.
- 6. **Protest** (n.) A statement or action expressing disapproval of or objection to something.
- 7. **Regulation** (n.) A rule or directive made and maintained by an authority (typically a government entity).
