- 1. **Democracy** (n.) A system of government by the whole population or all the eligible members of a state, typically through elected representatives.
- 2. Authoritarianism (n.) Any political system that concentrates power in the hands of a leader or a small elite that is not constitutionally responsible to the body of the people.
- 3. Backslide (v.) Relapse into bad ways or error.
- 4. **Dictatorship** (n.) A form of government in which one person or a small group possesses absolute power without effective constitutional limitations.
- 5. Illiberal (adj.) Opposed to liberal principles; restricting freedom of thought or behavior.
