- 1. **26th Amendment** (n.) The Twenty-sixth Amendment to the United States Constitution prohibits the states and the federal government from using age as a reason for denying the right to vote to citizens of the United States who are at least eighteen years old..
- 2. **Cognition** (n.) The mental action or process of acquiring knowledge and understanding through thought, experience, and the senses.
- 3. **Juvenile** (n.) A young person or of, for, or relating to young people.
- 4. **Suffrage** (n.) The right to vote in political elections.
- 5. **Primaries** (n.) A preliminary election to appoint delegates to a party conference or to select the candidates for a principal, especially presidential, election.
