The Filibuster

Directions: Frontload (introduce and review) these vocabulary words with your students to facilitate their understanding of the topic and coinciding resources:

- 1. **Filibuster** (n.) A political procedure in which one or more members of a legislative body prolong debate on proposed legislation so as to delay or entirely prevent a decision.
- 2. Cloture (n.) A procedure for ending a debate and taking a vote with a legislative body.
- 3. Simple Majority (n.) Fifty percent plus one of the full voting members.
- 4. **Super Majority** (n.) A requirement for a proposal to gain a specified level or type of support which exceeds a simple majority in order to have effect.
- 5. **Nuclear Option** (n.) A parliamentary procedure that allows the Senate to override a standing rule by a simple majority, rather than the two-thirds supermajority normally required to amend Senate rules.
