- 1. **Equal Rights Amendment**(n.) A proposed amendment to the US Constitution stating that civil rights may not be denied on the basis of one's sex.
- 2. **Constitution** (n.) A single written document that explicitly creates government institutions, defines the scope of government power, and guarantees certain civil liberties. This is how the term gets used under U.S. law.
- 3. **Ratify** (v.) A sign or give formal consent to (a treaty, contract, or agreement), making it officially valid.
- 4. **Discrimination** (n.) The unjust or prejudicial treatment of different categories of people or things, especially on the grounds of race, age, or sex.
- 5. **Bipartisan** (adj.) Involving the agreement or cooperation of two political parties that usually oppose each other's policies.
