## VOCABULARY

- 1. **Judicial** (adj.) referring to a judge, court or the court system
- 2. **Nominate** (v.) to propose as a candidate for election to office
- 3. **Confirm** (v.) to give approval to
- 4. **Appeal** (v.) to ask a higher court to reverse the decision of a trial court after final judgment or other legal ruling. (**appellate** is the noun for this type of court)
- 5. **Jurisdiction** (n.) the authority given by law to a court to try cases and rule on legal matters within a particular geographic area and/or over certain types of legal cases.
- 6. **Prosecutor** (n.) generic term for the government's attorney in a criminal case
- 7. **Defense attorney** (n.) a lawyer who regularly represents criminal defendants
