2022 Election: Ballot Measures

Vocabulary

Directions: Frontload (introduce and review) these vocabulary words with your students to facilitate their understanding of the topic and coinciding resources:

- 1. **Amendment** (n.) A minor change or addition designed to improve a text, piece of legislation, etc.
- 2. **Ballot** (n.) A process of voting, in writing and typically in secret.
- 3. **Ballot Measure** (n.) A law, issue, or question that appears on a statewide or local ballot for voters of that jurisdiction to decide.
- 4. **Bond** (n.) A debt security issued by a government to support government spending and obligations.
- 5. **Direct Democracy** (n.) A type of democratic form of government in which the electorate decides on policy initiatives without elected representatives as proxies.
- 6. **Referendum** (n.) A general vote by the electorate on a single political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.
