## Vocabulary

**Directions:** Frontload (introduce and review) these vocabulary words with your students to facilitate their understanding of the topic and coinciding resources:

- 1. **Defendant** (n.) An individual, company, or institution sued or accused in a court of law.
- 2. **Public Defender** (n.) A lawyer appointed to represent people who otherwise cannot reasonably afford to hire a lawyer to defend themselves in a trial.
- 3. **Pro Bono** (adj.) Denoting work undertaken without charge, especially legal work for a client with a low income.
- 4. **Indigent** (n.) An individual who is suffering from poverty, having no to very little money and resources.
- 5. Legal Counsel (n.) A person legally qualified to represent an individual or entity in a legal matter.
