Judicial Precedent

Vocabulary

Directions: Frontload (introduce and review) these vocabulary words with your students to facilitate their understanding of the topic and coinciding resources:

- 1. **Judicial system** (n.) the system of law courts that administer justice
- 2. **Precedent** (n.) A court decision in an earlier case with facts and legal issues similar to a dispute currently before a court.
- 3. *Stare decisis* (n.) a foundational concept in the American legal system and a Latin term that means "let the decision stand" or "to stand by things decided"
- 4. **Vacatur** (n.) to set aside a judgment; a court announcement saying something is canceled
- 5. **Overrule** (v.) to make a decision that opposes and changes another decision or suggestion from a position of higher authority
